The doctorate in Anthropology (PhD in Anthropology) is a program targeting the development of independent research, specializing in investigating socio-cultural phenomena and problems. Its graduates will contribute to the advancement of knowledge in the field, with a strong background in theories and anthropological methodologies. They will be able to contribute as academics and researchers in higher education and research positions, among others. The program is composed of excellent faculty, with expertise in anthropology and related social sciences.

This program was supported by an Institutional Development Grant from the Wenner-Gren Foundation and works in collaboration with anthropology departments at three partner institutions: University College London, Pontificia Universidad Católica del Perú and Stanford University.

# Internal Scholarships

The following scholarships are available to students who do not receive funding from external sources::

**Teaching Assistant Scholarship:** covers 100% of tuition and offers a stipend for doctoral students who start their studies or have passed their candidacy exam and started their thesis work. It is coordinated with the application period of the ANID Scholarship for Doctoral Studies in Chile.

**Millennium Institute for Research on Violence and Democracy Scholarship (VioDemos):** awarded to applicants whose projects fall within one of its 3 research areas: structural violence and inequality; criminal violence and insecurity; and political and ethnic violence.

**UC Doctoral fellowship for the research project "The New Normal, an Ethnographic Approach",** lead by professor Daniel Miller from UCL Anthropology department.

**Residence Benefits for Doctoral Students:** covers 100% of the tuition for the students who have finished registering all credits from their Doctoral Program, including thesis credits and those still pending completion.
